Position Summary:

Under general direction of the Public Safety Director, performs a wide range of administrative and executive level support functions. Achieves results through direction, assistance and coordination of all department activities. Provides executive level administrative assistance support functions to management within the Public Safety Department. Consistently applies the Pueblo's Core Values in support of Workforce Excellence. Maintains confidentiality of all privileged information.

This list of duties and responsibilities is illustrative only of the tasks performed by this position and is not all-inclusive.

Essential Duties & Responsibilities:

- Maintains communication with and provides relevant administrative support for Programs within the Department.
- Screens incoming calls, visitors, and correspondence; routes to program staff as required; may respond to inquiries independently based on nature of contact.
- Applies/exhibits professional etiquette and demeanor in contacts consistently.
- Reads, researches and routes correspondence; drafts letters and documents; collects and analyzes information; initiates telecommunications for Director.
- Maintains calendar and appointments for Director. Coordinates and arranges meetings, conferences, programs, and other events.
- Prepares correspondence, reports, meeting minutes, resolutions, and other documents and communications from drafts, recordings, or verbal instruction.
- Edits and reviews correspondence and documents for correct grammar, punctuation, and spelling.
- Develops, implements, and manages general administrative office support systems, including records and file management, and clerical and administrative duties.
- Assists in preparing annual budget and budget modifications; conducts research and analysis of the cost of office operations; prepares reports and supporting data for the annual budget; maintains department budgets, utilizes cuff accounts, and works accordingly with the accounting office.
- Completes and ensures the processing of personnel action forms, purchase requests, requests for payment, travel requests, and other administrative documents.
- Creates and maintains database and spreadsheet files; develops required narrative and statistical reports.
- Monitors and expedites time dependent activities and projects.
- Assists in the resolution of operational issues between departmental programs.
- Assists, as directed the Pueblo Emergency Management Program in its response to public emergency incidents.
- Contributes to a team effort and accomplishes related results as required.
- Performs other duties as required.

Minimum Qualifications:

Bachelor's degree in Business Administration or closely related field required. Five (5) years of administrative or executive level experience. Three (3) years advanced computer experience, preferred. FEMA/ICS 100, 200, 700, and 800 Certifications, preferred; must obtain within six (6) months of hire. A combination of closely relevant education and directly related work experience may be considered. Fluency in the Laguna language preferred.

Background Investigation Requirements:

The Pueblo of Laguna has a Suitability Policy for background investigation processes. Every position in the government operation is reviewed and designated at one of three risk levels. The determination is commensurate with public trust responsibilities and attributes of the position which includes job duties. The Executive Assistant-Public Safety is designated as a High-Risk Public Trust (HRPT) position.
